PM says water ‘lifeblood’ of region, must never be weaponised

CM Shah reaffirms Sindh Assembly’s authority on provincial unity

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STAFF REPORT, KARACHI: Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah on Monday reiterated that any decision regarding the status or territorial integrity of Sindh rests solely with the Sindh Assembly, declaring that the province would remain united and that all debates on its future must be conducted through the constitutional forum of the provincial legislature.

Addressing the Sindh Assembly, the Chief Minister said the House had repeatedly expressed its position against the division of Sindh through resolutions adopted in 1948, 2000, 2014, 2019, and 2026. He emphasised that the issue had been debated on several occasions and that the Assembly remained the ultimate forum for deliberation and decision-making on

the matter.

“The decision regarding Sindh’s division will not be made by businessmen in Lahore, courts, public gatherings, television seminars, or any other forum. It is the elected representatives in the Sindh Assembly who will debate and decide the matter,” he said.

Murad Ali Shah noted that his government had decided to allow a more comprehensive discussion on the issue and had therefore brought an adjournment motion to facilitate debate. He explained that under parliamentary rules, an adjournment motion takes precedence over an ordinary resolution because it allows all routine business to be suspended for discussion of an issue of public importance.

“The outcome of this debate is already clear-Sindh will never be divided,” he said. The Chief Minister stated that an adjournment motion requires the support of at least 34 members and added that the opposition was free to bring such a motion if it wished. However, he remarked that the opposition lacked the courage to table a resolution supporting the division of Sindh.

He maintained that the Sindh Assembly was the proper constitutional forum for discussing the province’s future and that all viewpoints should be heard within the House. “The Assembly must hear both sides of the argument and take the debate to its logical conclusion,” he said.

Referring to constitutional principles,

Murad Ali Shah said state authority is exercised through elected representatives and that the Assembly is the institution empowered to represent the will of the people of Sindh. “The elected representatives of Sindh will decide Sindh’s future,” he said, adding that the province has existed for centuries and that its people played a historic role in the creation of Pakistan. He noted that the Pakistan Resolution was also endorsed by this representative institution. The Chief Minister said the Pakistan Peoples Party would continue to defend the unity and integrity of Sindh. “As long as PPP members are present in this House, Sindh will remain a united province,” he declared.

FM Dar, Iranian counterpart reaffirm importance of continued engagement

STAFF REPORT, Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar met Iranian Foreign Minister Seyyed Abbas Araghchi in Bishkek ahead of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Council of Heads of State meeting on Tuesday, where the two sides reaffirmed the importance of continued engagement, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) said.



FM Dar arrived alongside Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in the Kyrgyz capital for a three-day official visit to attend the SCO Council of Heads of State meeting and the SCO Plus Summit, besides assuming Pakistan’s chairmanship of the council for 2026-27. The two foreign ministers exchanged views on “bilateral relations and regional developments”. Dar underscored that “dialogue and diplomacy remain essential to promoting peace and stability in the region.” He further stressed that “sincere implementation by both parties to the conflict of the Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) of June 2026 remains the only way forward.” The Foreign Office (FO) said the interaction between Dar and Araghchi was a “warm exchange,” with the two foreign ministers reaffirming the importance of continued engagement and discussing regional developments and bilateral relations. Dar also met Azerbaijan Foreign Minister Jeyhun Bayramov on Tuesday on the sidelines of the SCO Council of Heads of State meeting in Bishkek.

In a post on X, the FO said Dar “met with Foreign Minister of the Republic of Azerbaijan, Jeyhun Bayramov, on the sidelines of the SCO Council of Heads of State meeting in Bishkek today”. The FO said the two sides “reaffirmed the strong bonds of friendship and brotherhood between Pakistan and Azerbaijan and expressed their commitment to further strengthening the bilateral partnership”. The two foreign ministers also “exchanged views on regional and international developments and matters of mutual interest”, the FO said. Earlier in the day, Dar met Türkiye’s National Intelligence Organisation (MIT) Director Ibrahim Kalin on the sidelines of the SCO Council of Heads of State meeting in Bishkek on Tuesday.

Pakistan to Head Makkah Defence Alliance Secretariat



MONITORING DESK, ISTANBUL: Top political and military leaders from Pakistan, Saudi Arabia and Türkiye convened in Istanbul on Monday to institutionalise their trilateral defence cooperation under the Makkah Agreement for Joint Defence, announcing the establishment of a permanent secretariat and pledging deeper military-industrial integration.

The meeting, held in the Strategic Political and Defence Committee format, was attended by the foreign ministers, defence ministers and chiefs of defence forces of the three nations. From Pakistan, Deputy Prime Minister/ Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar, Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif and Chief of Army Staff and Chief of Defence Forces (COAS & CDF) Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir attended the meeting.

In a joint statement issued after the talks, the coun-

tries affirmed their shared commitment to regional stability and collective deterrence. “Acting with a sense of regional ownership, the three countries reiterate their determination to work together within the framework of the Makkah Agreement to achieve sustainable peace and stability in their region,” the statement read.

The ministers further agreed to support de-escalation and restraint in regional crises, favouring peaceful diplomatic resolutions.

The most significant outcome of Monday’s meeting was the decision to establish a permanent secretariat to coordinate the alliance’s activities. The secretariat will be headquartered in Saudi Arabia and initially headed by a secretary general from Pakistan, who will serve a three-year term. The move is intended to “enhance their solidarity, ensure the credibility and effectiveness of their collective deterrence and defence, and contribute to regional efforts and cooperative security towards a just, inclusive and lasting peace,” according to the joint communiqué. Beyond administrative institutionalisation, the three countries committed to expanding defence industry collaboration. The statement outlined plans for “joint technology development and production” and joint military activities aimed at strengthening the cohesion and interoperability of their armed forces.

IHC directs Adiala jail authorities not to keep Imran, Bushra in isolation

STAFF REPORT, The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Tuesday directed Adiala jail authorities not to keep former prime minister Imran Khan and his wife, Bushra Bibi, in solitary confinement while disposing of petitions challenging their alleged isolation in jail. Justice Khadim Hussain Somroo announced the reserved verdict on petitions seeking to declare the alleged solitary confinement of Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi illegal. The petitions were filed by

Aleema Khanum on behalf of Imran and Mubashra Khawar Maneka, the daughter of Bushra Bibi, against the alleged solitary confinement of the former prime minister and first lady. Imran has remained in prison since August 2023 following convictions he and his party describe as politically motivated. Since his ouster in April 2022 following a no-confidence vote, he has faced multiple legal cases. During the hearing today, the court directed the Adiala jail superinten-

dent to ensure that both Imran and Bushra were not kept in solitary confinement. It also directed jail authorities to facilitate a meeting between them. The IHC further ordered that the PTI founding chairman be allowed meetings with his family in accordance with jail rules and be provided telephone access to speak with his sons. The court also specified that the telephone facility should be withdrawn if recordings of Imran’s conversations with his sons were used for political purposes.

Govt floats fresh LNG tender as shortage fuels power outages

STAFF REPORT, ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has floated a fresh tender to import a spot LNG cargo for delivery in early September as a shortage of re-gasified liquefied natural gas (RLNG), particularly for the power sector, continues to contribute to hours-long electricity outages across the country. State-run Pakistan LNG Limited (PLL) on Sunday invited international suppliers to bid for 140,000 cubic meters of LNG, with a tolerance of plus or minus 5.0 per cent, for delivery at Port Qasim between September 4

and September 8, 2026. The emergency procurement comes after the government apologised to the nation last week over prolonged power outages and attributed the load shedding partly to a shortage of LNG needed for power generation. PLL, which procures LNG from international markets and arranges its onward supply to consumers, has sought bids on a Delivered Ex-Ship (DES) basis for delivery at the Pakistan Gas Port Consortium Limited terminal at Port Qasim, Karachi.

Trump’s Board of Peace and the politics of control

The history of American power is, in many ways, the history of reinventing rules – or designing new ones – to fit strategic US interests. This may sound harsh but it is a necessary realization, particularly in light of US President Donald Trump's latest political invention: the “Board of Peace.”

Some have hastily concluded that Trump's newest political gambit – unveiled last week at the World Economic Forum in Davos – is a uniquely Trumpian endeavor, detached from earlier US foreign policy doctrines. They are mistaken, misled largely by Trump's self-centered political style and his constant, though unfounded, claims that he has ended wars, resolved global conflicts and made the world a safer place.

At the Davos launch, Trump reinforced this carefully crafted illusion, boasting of America's supposed historic leadership in bringing peace, praising alleged unprecedented diplomatic breakthroughs and presenting the Board of Peace as a neutral, benevolent mechanism capable of stabilizing

the world's most volatile regions.

Yet a less prejudiced reading of history allows us to see Trump's political designs – whether in Gaza or beyond – not as an aberration but as part of a familiar pattern. US foreign policymakers repeatedly seek to reclaim ownership of global affairs, sideline international consensus and impose political frameworks that they alone define, manage and ultimately control.

The Board of Peace – an invitation-only political club controlled entirely by Trump – is increasingly taking shape as a new geopolitical reality. Through this scheme, the US is imposing itself as the self-appointed caretaker of global affairs, beginning with genocide-devastated Gaza, and positioning itself as an alternative to the UN.

The irony is staggering. A body ostensibly meant to guide Gaza through reconstruction after Israel's devastating genocide does not include Palestinians – let alone Gazans. Even more damning is the fact that the genocide it claims to address was politically backed, militarily financed and diplomatically shielded by successive US administra-

tions, first under Joe Biden and later Trump.

It requires no particular insight to conclude that Trump's Board of Peace is not concerned with peace, nor genuinely with Gaza. So what, then, is this initiative really about?

It is not about reconstruction or justice but about exploiting Gaza's suffering to impose a new US-led world order, first in the Middle East and eventually beyond.

Gaza – a besieged territory of just 365 sq. km – does not require a new political structure populated by dozens of world leaders, each reportedly paying a \$1 billion membership fee. Gaza needs reconstruction, its people must be granted their basic rights and Israel's crimes must be met with accountability. The mechanisms to achieve this already exist: the UN, international law, long-standing humanitarian institutions and, above all, the Palestinians themselves, whose agency, resilience and determination to survive Israel's onslaught have become legendary.

The Board of Peace discards all of this in favor of a hollow, improvised structure tailored to advance US-Israeli political and geopolitical interests. In effect, it drags Palestine

back a century, to an era when Western powers unilaterally determined its fate, guided by racist assumptions about Palestinians and the Middle East – assumptions that laid the groundwork for the region's enduring catastrophes.

Yet the central question remains: Is this truly a uniquely Trumpian initiative?

No, it is not. This is a familiar American tactic, particularly during moments of profound crisis. This strategy is persuasively outlined in Naomi Klein's 2007 book “The Shock Doctrine: The Rise of Disaster Capitalism,” which argues that political and economic elites exploit collective trauma – wars, natural disasters and social breakdown – to impose radical policies that would otherwise face public resistance.

Trump's Board of Peace fits squarely within this framework, using the devastation of Gaza not as a call for justice or accountability but as an opportunity to reshape political realities in ways that entrench US dominance and sideline international norms. This is hardly unprecedented. The pattern can be traced back to the US-envisioned UN, estab-

lished in 1945 as a replacement for the League of Nations. Its principal architect, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, was determined that the new institution would secure the structural dominance of the US, most notably through the Security Council and the veto system, ensuring Washington's decisive influence over global affairs. When the UN later failed to fully acquiesce to US interests – most notably when it refused to grant the George W. Bush administration legal authorization to invade Iraq – the organization was labeled “irrelevant.” Bush then led his own so-called coalition of the willing into a war of aggression that devastated Iraq and destabilized the entire region, with consequences that persist to this day. A similar maneuver unfolded in Palestine with the 2002 invention of the Quartet on the Middle East, a US-dominated framework. From its inception, the Quartet systematically sidelined Palestinian agency, insulated Israel from accountability and relegated international law to a secondary – and often expendable – consideration.

This means paying compliments and issuing praise whenever necessary.

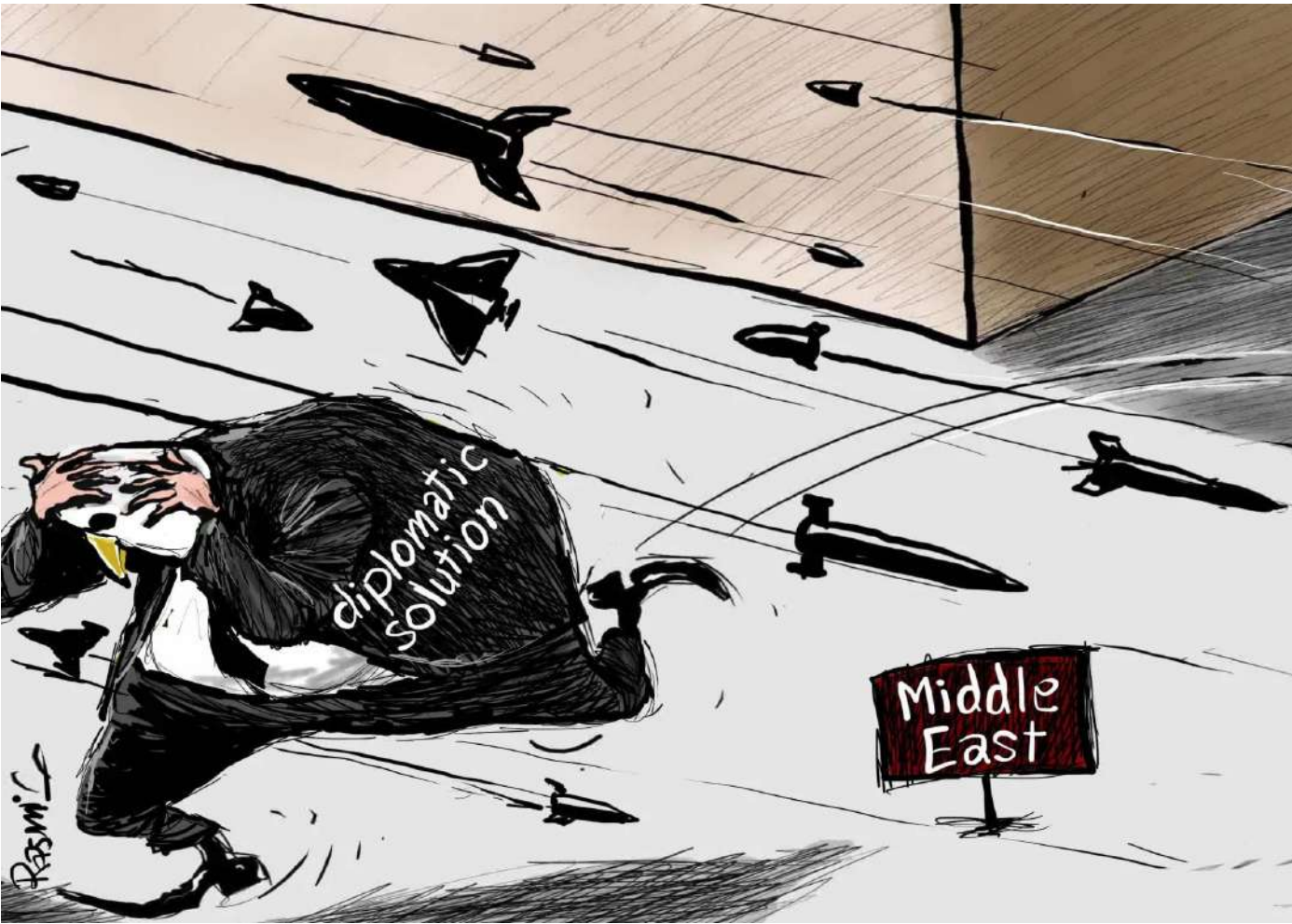
Don't say that Mr. President is following in his predecessor's footsteps. Mr. President has his own unique path. His style is out of the ordinary and his own. He doesn't imitate anyone and no one can imitate him. I once asked a man who worked with Saddam Hussein if any member of the Baath Party's central command had ever implied to Mr. President that the decision to invade Kuwait was catastrophic, reckless or costly. The answer was no secret. Tariq Aziz said it pained him to remain seated during the meeting in which it was announced that Kuwait would be annexed and become an Iraqi province. He realized the dangers but, when confronted with the ruthless people surrounding the president, he chose to keep his thoughts to himself. Saddam once met with Iranian Foreign Minister Sadegh Ghotbzadeh on the sidelines of a Non-

Aligned Movement summit in Havana. The minister flattered the president. At the end of the meeting, Iraqi Ambassador to the UN Salah Omar Al-Ali described the talks as positive and that more could be built upon them. Mr. President was quick to reprimand him, saying: “Don't ever say that again. I will break the Iranians and reclaim every inch of territory they seized.” Al-Ali realized the difficulty of offering advice to the “historic leader.” During a trip to Damascus, I met with President Bashar Assad and then-Vice President Abdul Halim Khaddam. I asked Khaddam about why Bashar was chosen to succeed his father Hafez. Khaddam knew the walls had many ears, so he replied by saying that he was the natural choice. Bashar was raised around his father and grew up in his environment, so it was normal for the party leadership to name him as successor. Years later, I again met with Khaddam, who by then was living in Paris after defecting from the regime. I asked him the same question and he replied that, at the time, he had been summoned by Hafez and informed that the decision related to Bashar had been taken. So, Khaddam had no role in Bashar's rise to power. He said Bashar was not fit to assume such a major post. The party's policy of having sons inherit their father's position was wrong because it showed that Hafez had no one but his son to whom he could entrust the running of the country.

Libyan diplomat Ali Abdussalam Treki once told me that he hid his face in embarrassment when Muammar Qaddafi tore up a copy of the UN Charter while he was addressing the General Assembly. Treki admitted that he did not dare to call on the leader to cut short his speech, even when he had far exceeded his allotted time. Treki most certainly did not criticize the leader after the scandalous incident.

Has the world returned to the time of the strongman who does not recognize any borders or whom no aide or adviser dares to confront with even a fraction of the truth? We don't have the necessary information as to whether Vladimir Putin consulted Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov before ordering the Russian army to enter Ukraine. We don't know the veteran Lavrov's opinion, even if he were consulted. It is difficult to imagine that an aide to Donald Trump would have warned him of the dangerous precedent of kidnapping Venezuela's Nicolas Maduro. It is difficult to believe that an aide urged him to tone down his statements about NATO.

US’ Gaza ‘Master Plan’ clashes with reality

Anyone who saw Jared Kushner's PowerPoint presentation in Davos last week without knowing the topic would have struggled to identify the territory to which he was referring. Many might have thought this was for North America, with shiny new office and residential blocks and a certain space-age or Hollywood sci-fi feel to the slides of the “Master Plan.” The vaulting ambition of the speaker may have impressed his father-in-law, US President Donald Trump, who is certainly familiar with the world of real estate. No doubt Trump, the freshly minted chairman of the Board of Peace, was the premier target of the messaging. It reflected much of what was released at the announcement of Trump's “Gaza riviera” plan last February, which envisaged the Strip being entirely emptied of Palestinians. Even this version treats Gaza as a tabula rasa to impose whatever architectural fantasies its authors can conjure up. It treats the enclave as being devoid of any culture, tradition or history.

Others have been more skeptical – and with good reason. First of all, Israel has not even adhered to the Oct. 10 ceasefire and is bombing and shelling with intensity. Second, the full entry of aid, as referenced in the Trump peace plan, has not yet been achieved. Third, the plan presumes the disarmament of Hamas, something that is far from imminent. Finally, no international stabilization force is on the horizon. Those are the significant near-term impediments. Delivering this plan, at a time when the conflict still rages, will be nigh on impossible. Just clearing the 60 million tonnes of rubble, which is peppered with unexploded ordnance and a host of toxins, will take an age and cost a fortune.

One major element Kushner did not address was how the land would be acquired and whether owners would be compensated. According to a 2015 study, about half of the land in Gaza is privately owned. Much of the land is unregistered because owners did not wish to pay tax. What is clear is that the companies lining up to fill their coffers have no claim to the land at all. But progress also presumes the Israeli leadership will be comfortable with this. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is still smarting from the invitation that was extended to Turkey and Qatar to join the executive committee of the Board of Peace. Many members of Netanyahu's Cabinet and right-wing Knesset members have dreams of inhabiting these plush new riviera residences themselves.

Israel will have to consent as the occupying power. For starters, it will have to allow in all the construction materials and abandon its restrictive dual-use list. Throughout Kushner's presentation to world leaders and the business elite, it was clear that Palestinians have had no input into these plans – and not just because the Arabic on the slides was all wrong. He did not outline how the local Palestinians in Gaza would be won over by the project or where they would go during reconstruction. Kushner said Gaza would be run on free-market principles, as opposed to how Palestinians might wish to shape their economic future.

Do Palestinians want tourism, given the beachfront is all labeled for coastal tourism? Who decided on the importance of data centers at this stage? And how many of the companies making a fortune out of this dreamworld will be Palestinian and how many will be rich businessmen with no link to Gaza at all? The Palestinians in Gaza I have spoken to largely see this all as a sick joke. “Who is going to live in these villas and flashy apartments? Certainly not us Palestinians,” sighed one woman. Another said: “What will stop Israel from bombing them again? Where will our security come from? We need that before rich houses.” But there is also the issue of who will pay for it. The experts at the UN, those who actually have experience of such situations, calculate that postwar reconstruction will cost about \$70 billion. This is without the high-end infrastructure of Kushner's presentation. The UAE has reportedly expressed an interest in funding the first planned community on the outskirts of Rafah in the south. Beyond that, it is not clear. More alarming is who might make money out of it. This is a war zone profiteering racket. US companies are lining up at the trough. This is all premised on the naive and ill-founded belief that the entirety of Gaza's problems can be resolved with bulldozers, cranes and cement. The plan has echoes of earlier economic roadmaps for peace, but even those were not so divorced from reality. At no stage did the presentation reference a viable peace process or even mention that Gaza would be the western segment of an independent state of Palestine. It did not address a single one of the underlying causes or drivers of this 100-year-plus conflict. On this occasion, the last word goes to French President Emmanuel Macron, who was reported as saying: “Peace is not a real estate transaction. You cannot build stability on the erasure of a people's history and the privatization of their tragedy.”

There is scope for Trump to strike a deal on Greenland

US President Donald Trump has previously threatened both military action and trade tariffs on much of Europe as he tries to acquire Greenland. The irony is that there is significant scope for a deal to be done that secures US interests, should America's approach be based on skillful diplomacy that focuses on both security and commerce. The public debate tends to focus on two main options: that of US military action or the potentially expensive purchase of Greenland. However, there are other pathways, such as an agreement along the lines of the Compacts of Free Association, which the US has with three Pacific island nations.

Denmark, an EU member state and NATO member, has controlled Greenland for about 300 years. In 1916, the US formally recognized Copenhagen's interests in the island in exchange for the Danish West Indies, which became the US Virgin Islands. In recent decades, the autonomous territory that Greenland has become, with a population of about 57,000, has gone from direct Danish rule to much greater independence. Today, Denmark retains the powers of defense and foreign policy, monetary policy and justice.

The leaders of all five political parties in Greenland's parliament this month said in a joint statement that “we do not want to be Americans, we do not want to be Danes, we want to be Greenlanders.” While this may preclude any future US purchase of Greenland, Washington could push forward with diplomacy in other ways to boost its influence in and around the island. On the security front, the US first opened Thule Air Base (now known as the Pitufik Space Base) to house military assets in the 1940s. During the height of the Cold War, some 10,000 US troops were stationed on the island. The US has options to increase its military presence again very significantly, as long as it consults Denmark and Greenland. This could help to deliver

key goals of America's new security strategy, released in November, which puts greater emphasis on securing its interests in the Western Hemisphere.

This is what NATO Secretary-General Mark Rutte, a former Dutch prime minister, emphasized to Trump at the World Economic Forum in Davos last week. A growing number of European leaders, including Rutte, recognize the need for a bigger collective effort to work with the Trump team to try to make the Arctic (not only Greenland) safer for Western interests. For instance, numerous European countries, including the UK and Germany, are debating sending more military assets to Greenland and the wider region, including ships and aircraft, as Denmark is doing. This is not incompatible with allowing the US to also expand its military base there or build new ones.

Beyond security and Trump's cited concerns about China and Russia, what is often missing from his recent professions of interest in Greenland is its resource richness. As think tanks like the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington have shown, a defining feature of Trump's second presidency so far has been significant US efforts to secure greater access to critical minerals and other resources across the world. Greenland, which is currently about 80 percent ice-capped, is about 2.1 million sq. km in size. It boasts the world's northernmost point of land – the closest land to the North Pole – just off its coast. The growing economic focus on the Arctic stems, in large part, from the region's melting ice caps, which are opening up new shipping lanes. These have significantly decreased maritime trade transport times, allowing ships to bypass the Suez and Panama canals. The melting ice caps are also exposing unclaimed lands. This has been described as a modern-day gold rush, with states competing over resources including zinc, copper, iron ore and rare earth elements.

China gifts Islamabad 21 fire, rescue vehicles worth Rs3 billion

STAFF REPORT, China's Embassy in Pakistan announced on Tuesday that Beijing was gifting a modern fleet of 21 fire and rescue vehicles, valued at Rs3 billion, "to upgrade Islamabad's emergency response infrastructure". According to a post on X, the Chinese Embassy said the fleet would arrive this month and comprise an "advanced 88m snorkel tender", substantially bolstering emergency response capability and high-rise rescue operations across the capital.

The embassy added that the fleet was a "testament to our timeless, All-Weather Strategic Cooperative Partnership serving and protecting our communities together".

Reinforcing our shared commitment to public safety and disaster resilience. China is gifting a modern fleet of 21 fire &

rescue vehicles valued at *PKR 3 Billion* to upgrade Islamabad's emergency response infrastructure.

The announcement came after 14 newborn babies were killed when a fire broke out on the third floor of the Mother and Child Hospital's war at Islamabad's Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences. The incident prompted citizens and political parties to begin demanding action against those responsible. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif later ordered immediate action against eight people identified by an inquiry committee over the fire, approving their suspension as well as departmental and criminal proceedings. Those suspended included the executive director.



The fleet is also another development in regards to the All-Weather Strategic Cooperative Partnership between Beijing and Islamabad, with the two agreeing earlier this year to deepen mutual trust,

practical cooperation, and defence and security cooperation.

The commitment came during Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's visit to China in May this year, when the two countries also released a joint communique noting that Islamabad had committed to taking steps to strengthen security measures, while Beijing reaffirmed its support for Pakistan in its fight against terrorism. On the occasion, China affirmed its position to work with Pakistan to establish the China-Pakistan Security Partnership, continue bilateral and multilateral counter-terrorism cooperation, and strengthen military-to-military cooperation. Later, in July, the two countries reaffirmed commitment to strengthening their strategic security partnership and expanding counterterrorism cooperation.

Ayaz welcomes PCA decision upholding Indus Waters Treaty

APP- ISLAMABAD: Speaker of National Assembly Sardar Ayaz Sadiq has welcomed the unanimous decision of the Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA) affirming that the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) remains fully in force and that India has no valid grounds to unilaterally suspend or terminate the Treaty. He said the decision was a significant affirmation of international law, treaty obligations and the principle that disputes must be resolved through peaceful and established legal mechanisms. Ayaz Sadiq said Pakistan had always respected international treaties and upheld international law and remained a strong proponent of dialogue and peaceful resolution of disputes. The Speaker said the Indus Waters Treaty is an important international agreement, directly linked to the livelihood, agriculture, economic development and prosperity of the region. He stressed that such a vital treaty must be respected and upheld in letter and spirit. Ayaz Sadiq said India's unilateral suspension of the IWT was not only contrary to the provisions of the Treaty but also inconsistent with the principles of international law. He also noted that the PCA's decision had further exposed the lack of legal justification for India's attempt to place the Treaty in abeyance and underscored the importance of India fulfilling its obligations under the agreement. Ayaz Sadiq said that the unilateral suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty by the Modi regime and its attempt to use water as a weapon against Pakistan amounted to water terrorism, with the potential to inflict serious humanitarian suffering, economic disruption and far-reaching consequences for regional peace and stability.

Rain or rush, traffic must keep moving: DIG orders stronger road discipline

APP- ISLAMABAD: Director General Safe City/DIG Traffic Muhammad Haroon Joya on Tuesday directed traffic officers to keep traffic moving smoothly during rainfall while stepping up action against lane violations, helmetless motorcyclists, non-standard number plates and tinted glasses across the federal capital. An official told APP on Tuesday that he issued the directions while chairing a meeting of traffic officers attended by Chief Traffic Officer (CTO) Kainat Azhar Khan and other officials, said a press release here. The meeting reviewed traffic management during rainy weather and measures required to prevent disruption on the city's roads. Haroon Joya directed officers to remain vigilant during rainfall and take necessary measures to maintain smooth traffic flow and facilitate road users. He also ordered effective enforcement against motorists violating lane discipline and using non-standard number plates or tinted glasses, as well as motorcyclists riding without helmets. The DIG Traffic further directed officers to address parking problems at public and tourist places, where improper parking could create difficulties for visitors and other road users. He asked traffic officers to ensure better travel facilities for citizens and take necessary measures to keep traffic organised and roads convenient for commuters.

165 village conservation committees set up under Green Pakistan Programme

APP- ISLAMABAD: As many as 165 village conservation committees (VCCs) have been established in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) under the wildlife component of the Upscaling Green Pakistan Programme (UGPP), as the country expands community participation in wildlife and habitat conservation.

According to official data available with Wealth Pakistan, detailing progress on major wildlife activities under the UGPP from FY2019 to the third quarter of FY2025-26, AJK accounts for 115 of the committees, while another 50 have been established in KP.

The table records no VCCs under this particular activity for Punjab, Sindh, Balochistan or Gilgit-Baltistan. AJK therefore accounts for nearly 70% of the 165 committees established, with KP accounting for the remain-



der. The VCCs form part of a wider range of wildlife interventions undertaken under the programme, which include the expansion and management of protected areas, wildlife monitoring, community-based conservation, eco-tourism infrastructure and measures to curb illegal wildlife trade.

The progress data show that 131

new protected areas have been established under the Protected Areas Initiative. Punjab accounts for 65, KP 29, Balochistan and AJK two each, and Gilgit-Baltistan 16.

Another 70 management plans for protected areas have been developed, including 32 in Gilgit-Baltistan, 20 in AJK, 14 in KP, three in Punjab and one in Balochistan.

Ufone, Telenor Pakistan secure nine awards at Dragons of Pakistan 2026

Warner Bros. announces reopening of buyout talks

Discovery, which owns CNN, announced in late October that it was open to acquisition offers. Its board subsequently accepted a bid from Netflix to buy only its streaming and studio business. Paramount Skydance is seeking to buy all of Warner Bros. Discovery for \$108 billion. Netflix is offering \$83 billion for its more limited merger. The Netflix offer does not include Warner Bros. Discovery's television properties such as CNN and Discovery. Those would belong to a newly created, publicly traded company called Discovery Global if the deal goes through. Paramount Skydance accuses the Warner Bros. Discovery board of failing to present shareholders with the details needed to properly compare its offer to the Netflix bid.

Sunil Malhotra, father of Sidharth Malhotra, dies in Delhi

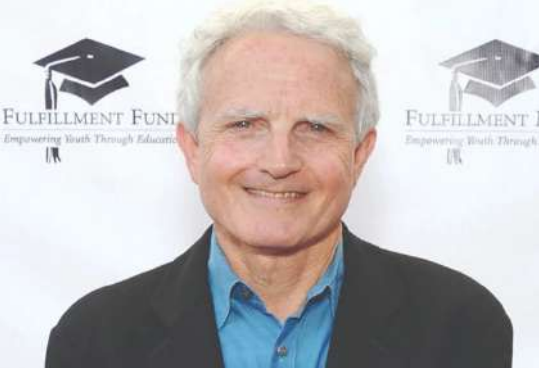

Celebrated songwriter Billy Steinberg dies at 75

He died following a battle with cancer, his attorney told the Los Angeles Times and BBC News. “Billy Steinberg's life was a testament to the enduring power of a well-written song — and to the idea that honesty, when set to music, can outlive us all,” his family said in a statement to the outlets. Steinberg was born in 1950 and grew up in Palm Springs, California, where his family had a table grape business. He attended Bard College in New York and soon began his career in songwriting. He helped write five number one singles on the Billboard Hot 100 list. Among those was “Like a Virgin,” co-written with Tom Kelly, which spent six consecutive weeks at the top of the charts. Steinberg won a Grammy Award in 1997 for his work on Celine Dion's “Falling Into You.”

Musadik calls for scaling up groundwater recharge to protect Islamabad aquifers

APP- ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Climate Change and Environmental Coordination Dr Musadik Masood Malik here on Tuesday called for scaling up groundwater recharge initiatives to address the continued decline in the city's groundwater reserves.

Addressing an event titled, "Protecting Islamabad's Aquifers" at the United Nations Educational Foundation in Pakistan (USEFP) auditorium, the minister said around 200 recharge wells had been constructed in the capital, an important pilot initiative needed to be expanded.

He said the estimated increase in the water table from the recharge interventions was 0.4 millimetres, compared with a decline of around 1.5 metres.

Dr. Musadik stressed that the focus should be on expanding recharge efforts



sufficiently to reduce groundwater depletion and eventually reverse the declining trend.

He said the recharge-well initiative was an important achievement but should not be considered the final solution.

The minister also highlighted the need

for improved management of surface and groundwater following recent heavy rainfall the capital.

He said around 200 millimetres of rainfall had been recorded in the capital.

Referring to flooding, Dr Musadik said several areas had been affected and relevant authorities and organisations had been directed to respond to the situation.

The minister also expressed concern over water quality and said treatment facilities were operating in Rawalpindi and Islamabad.

He said the treatment plants helped reduce contamination in treated water but stressed the need for continued attention to water quality.

Dr Musadik also raised the issue of

delays in establishing an additional water treatment plant, saying the project had remained pending for several years despite repeated tendering.

He said delays in implementing development projects were not limited to the Capital Development Authority (CDA) and could be observed across government departments.

The minister said progress had recently been made on the project as the tendering process was under way.

Dr. Musadik also discussed the importance of protecting Pakistan's water interests and the role of international treaties and legal mechanisms in ensuring water security. He said respect for international agreements was important for maintaining stability and protecting the rights of countries dependent on shared water resources.

Melting glaciers fuel fears of sudden floods

APP- ISLAMABAD: The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) on Tuesday issued alerts for possible glacial lake outburst floods (GLOFs), flash floods and landslides in Gilgit-Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Azad Kashmir, while warning of heavy to torrential rainfall in Potohar and upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa from Sept 2 to 5 due to ongoing monsoon rains, rising temperatures and accelerated glacier melt. The alert was issued by the NDMA's National Emergencies Operations Centre (NEOC), which warned that rising temperatures and continued monsoon rainfall had increased the risk of glacial lakes bursting and triggering sudden floods in vulnerable mountainous areas. The sensitive areas in Gilgit-Baltistan include Ghizer, Hunza, Nagar, Shigar, Gilgit, Roundu, Diamer, Astore, Skardu, Ghanche, Kharmang and the Neelum Valley in Azad Kashmir.

In Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Chitral, Upper and Lower Dir, Swat, Shangla, Kohistan, Mansehra, Buner and adjoining mountainous areas also face the risk of flash floods and landslides.

The NDMA has directed relevant departments to maintain continuous monitoring of vulnerable glaciers, glacial lakes, rivers, streams and nullahs and remain on high alert.

Local administrations have been asked to take timely precautionary measures, pre-position essential resources in vulnerable areas and keep evacuation arrangements in place.

The NEOC has also forecast thunderstorms and heavy to torrential rains in Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Murree, Galiyat and adjoining areas from Sept 2 to 5.

Heavy rainfall is also expected in Dir, Swat, Buner, Malakand, Shangla, Battagram, Kohistan, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Haripur, Nowshera, Swabi, Mardan and Peshawar.

The authority warned that intense rainfall could trigger urban flooding in cities, while mountainous areas could face flash floods and landslides.

Engro Corporation to sell 56.19% stake in EPCL to Lotte Chemical Pakistan



APP- ISLAMABAD: Engro Holdings Limited on Tuesday announced that its wholly-owned subsidiary, Engro Corporation Limited, had entered into a Share Purchase Agreement (SPA) with Lotte Chemical Pakistan Limited for the sale and transfer of its entire shareholding in Engro Polymer & Chemicals Limited (EPCL).

According to a news release, under the agreement, Engro Corporation will sell its approximately 56.19% stake in EPCL's issued and paid-up ordinary share capital for approximately Rs19.7 billion, subject to regulatory approvals and other customary conditions.

EPCL has been a core part of Engro Corporation's portfolio since 1997 and has played an important role in the development of Pakistan's downstream petrochemicals sector.

Over this period, Engro expanded the business, helping establish EPCL as Pakistan's only integrated chlor-vinyl complex and a key supplier to multiple downstream industries, with products including PVC resin, caustic soda and hydrogen peroxide, among others.

Beyond its operational footprint, EPCL has contributed to the development of strong technical capabilities within Pakistan's manufacturing sector, becoming a training ground for engineering talent across the petrochemicals industry.

The proposed transaction reflects the continuing evolution of the Engro Group following its restructuring in 2025, which led to the creation of Engro Holdings as the conglomerate's investment arm.

Since then, Engro Holdings has actively executed its mandate through significant decisions, including the USD562 million Deodar transaction, one of Pakistan's largest private-sector deals in more than a decade.

The proposed EPCL transaction would represent another portfolio decision aligned with this approach, enabling Engro to recycle capital into future growth opportunities that strengthen the quality and resilience of its portfolio.

Commenting on the transaction, Abdul Samad Dawood, CEO of Engro Holdings, said EPCL had been one of

Engro's flagship businesses.

"For nearly three decades, we have partnered with leading international companies to build capabilities, strengthen operations, and contribute to Pakistan's industrial development," he said.

"We believe the proposed transaction would allow us to realise the value and learnings created through that journey while unlocking synergies for EPCL within a larger petrochemicals platform. At the same time, it would strengthen our ability to pursue new investment opportunities and continue building a resilient portfolio that compounds value for shareholders over the long term," he added.

Adnan Afridi, CEO of Lotte Chemical Pakistan Limited, said the combination would create a stronger platform for sustainable growth, operational excellence and innovation.

"The identified synergies, coupled with the complementary strengths of both businesses, would enhance our competitiveness while enabling us to deliver greater value to our customers and stakeholders through the proposed transaction," he said.

"We remain committed to investing in our people, technology, sustainability, operational excellence, and future expansion projects that will strengthen Pakistan's manufacturing base and contribute to long-term economic development," he added.

The completion of the proposed transaction remains subject to regulatory approvals and the fulfilment of required conditions.

NADRA, FBISE Sign Agreement to Integrate Student Records

APP- ISLAMABAD: The National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) and the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (FBISE) have signed an agreement to integrate the student registration system for Matriculation and Intermediate examinations.

APP- ISLAMABAD: Following heavy rainfall in Islamabad and surrounding areas, the water level in Rawal Dam has risen to 1,751.90 feet, prompting authorities to open the dam's spillways at 2:00 pm.

The district administration has directed Rescue 1122, police, and other departments to remain on high alert during the operation. The District Administration Islamabad announced that the water level in Rawal Dam increased significantly after continuous rainfall across the federal capital and nearby regions. According to officials, the reservoir's water level reached 1,751.90 feet, leading authorities to decide to open the spillways to regulate the inflow and maintain safe water levels. The administration has instructed Rescue 1122, Islamabad Police and other relevant departments to remain fully prepared during the release of water. Authorities have also directed all concerned institutions to implement neces-

sary safety measures before and during the operation. Officials said coordination among emergency and civic agencies is underway to monitor the situation and respond promptly to any developments resulting from increased water discharge.

The district administration urged residents to stay away from streams, drainage channels and low-lying areas while the spillways remain open. Citizens have been advised to avoid unnecessary visits to locations near watercourses and to follow instructions issued by local authorities.

The administration said precautionary arrangements are being made to minimize risks and ensure public safety. Monitoring teams will continue to observe water levels and conditions around the dam throughout the operation.
